Aims


The child's achievement and wellbeing are at the centre of all we do, our aims are:

- create and maintain an environment that is safe, warm, friendly and welcoming.
- provide a stimulating and challenging curriculum that builds on outstanding teaching, outstanding TA support and high expectations of pupils.
- work with parents and outside agencies to meet the needs of our learners.
- establish an environment that builds upon the existing baseline of each individual need, and one that has the capability to challenge academically.
- foster within the school an ethos that prioritises regard for others, where the rights and dignity of pupils and staff are upheld, and where teamwork is nurtured to the advantage of all.
- encourage pupils to make the 'right choices' in their lives.



A positive, supportive link between home and school is vitally important for the academic and social development of all children.

Whitchurch High School Special Resource Base (SRB) has the capacity to teach up to 70 pupils whose statements include predominantly Severe Learning Difficulties (SLD) and also a range of other Additional Learning Needs (ALN). Our KS3 SRB is based in Lower School and our KS4/KS5 SRB is based in Upper School. Throughout the year there are opportunities for parents to discuss problems and celebrate successes with staff, as well as in annual review meetings and parents evening. WHS is a large school so to support communication we have provided a structure showing you who holds what position in the school, and how the SRB fits into that structure.

At Whitchurch High School SRB pupils are taught through National Curriculum subject areas.

These are differentiated to a level which enables each pupil to succeed. In addition, pupils are offered a variety of opportunities according to their interests and abilities. Emphasis is placed on developing pupils' physical, communicative and life skills.

The school has three curriculum stages:

- KS3 (11-14 year olds)
- KS4 (14-16 year olds)
- KS5 (16-18 year olds)

At each stage of the curriculum the following areas are targeted:

Core Educational

Language, Literacy and Communication Skills - Pupils are immersed in language experiences and activities. Their skills develop following a literacy programme, talking, signing/communicating and listening. They should be encouraged to communicate their needs, feelings and thoughts, encouraged to discuss experiences in individual and group play.

Numeracy Skills - Within the SRB at Whitchurch High School, pupils develop their skills, knowledge and understanding of mathematics through oral, practical and play activities. They enjoy using and applying mathematics in practical tasks, in real-life problems, and within mathematics itself. They use a variety of ICT resources as tools for exploring number, for obtaining real-life data and for presenting their findings.

Life Skills

Pupils should experience the familiar world through enquiry, investigating the indoor and outdoor environment in a safe and systematic way. They should be given experiences that help them to increase their curiosity about the world around them

Key Skills

We teach Key Skills through all curriculum subjects, and we also develop them within the pastoral curriculum. Key Skills form a cornerstone of curriculum planning throughout the school. For example, we give the children many opportunities to develop the application of number key skills in their geographical studies, and when we teach physical education we stress the importance of working with others.

What can you expect from the teaching assistants at Whitchurch High School SRB?

At Whitchurch High School SRB we know the strengths of each Teaching Assistant (TA). This allows us to match pupils up to Teaching Assistants best suited to them, thus gaining the most from each individual. Consistency across the Key Stages is essential and consequently all our teaching assistant staff aim to carry out the following when working with their pupils.

Transition - Getting to know you Pontio - Dod i'ch adnabod

Before a pupil starts at Whitchurch, a full transition plan should be in place.

Transition flow chart from Year 6 into Year 7

Consultation a proposed list of pupils from the Local Authority (LA) wishing to attend WHS SRB is provided to the school

February Half Term - After initial consultation a preliminary decision is reached

Up to 10 pupils can be educated at the SRB per year group, this list is collated and Statements amended

This should start at the Annual Review in Yr. 5 or 6. An amended statement naming Whitchurch is needed by May ½ term for successful transitions to occur.

Good planning creates an invaluable opportunity for the school to gain information from the parents and carers regarding their child's level of understanding, speech and language development and physical development.

The majority of pupils starting at Whitchurch are working within the P Scales (pre national curriculum).

Annual Reviews

All Whitchurch SRB children have a Statement of Educational Needs. Children have an Annual Review which enables parents/carers, the Local Authority and other agencies involved to review the Special Educational Needs Statement, discuss progress and set targets for the forthcoming year. Parents/carers are expected to attend Annual Review Meetings.

School Meals

Pupils can choose to have a cooked meal or bring in a packed lunch. All our meals are cooked on site. School meals provide a healthy balanced diet at a reasonable cost. The school complies with Appetite for Life.

Please note that:

All communication with staff within the SRB must come via the SRB administration team. This ensures all queries are dealt with fairly and efficiently.

The Lead Teacher will only be able to respond to parents between 3.15 and 4.30 each day, other than in exceptional circumstances.

What do staff at Whitchurch High School SRB expect from pupils?

Always be polite

Do your own learning

Bring your pen and planners

Praise, positive behaviour strategies and reward play a significant role in helping children to achieve. This will be positively encouraged with pupils by all staff.

In order to create an environment that is conducive to learning, students will have a clear understanding of behavioural expectations, in and out of the classroom.

Effective classroom management is a corporate responsibility and as such, is the responsibility of all members of staff. It is acknowledged that certain incidents need to be referred using the structured framework. Behaviour or attainment issues will be managed by individual teaching staff, with the assistance of support staff conducting the lesson.

The SRB School Standards are displayed in all classrooms and will form the basis of being a Whitchurch Pupil.
